## INSTRUCTIONS

In this activity you will learn about ---- by playing Hospital Bingo! SUPPLIES YOU'LL NEED: BINGO CARD & PENCIL or PEN

#### GETTING READY

This is an activity that is fun to do at your hospital. To get ready, have an adult help you find a map of the area you will be traveling. This may be a local city a, state map, or even a country map if you are going for a long drive. Ask your family if it is ok for you to draw on this map. You'll want to put a start near every interesting point.


#### DIRECTIONS

STEP 1: Review your Bingo Card. Take a few minutes to look at all of the items listed on your Bingo Card. Ask an adult if you are unclear on any of the items. With adult permission, you can also go online and look up images of each item.



STEP 3: Here's how to play - The next time you are on a road trip. Get your Bingo sheet. Look for items from the road that are on your card, such as a field of corn, or horse in a pasture. When you see them, call them out loudly and mark your board. The first person to get 5 spaces in a row (up and down across, or diagonal) wins. You can even play this by yourself!

STEP 4: Have fun playing Bingo and learning about agriculture and your surrounding environment.



### ITEMS YOU MAY NOT BE FAMILIAR WITH:



STETHOSCOPE: a medical instrument for listening to the action of someone's heart or breathing, typically having a small disk-shaped resonator that is placed against the chest and two tubes connected to earpieces.



IV BAG: Intravenous therapy or IV therapy is the infusion of liquid substances directly into a vein. The word intravenous simply means "within vein."



PRESSURE CUFF: A sphygmomanometer or blood pressure meter is a device used to measure blood pressure, composed of an inflatable cuff to restrict blood flow, and a mercury or mechanical manometer to measure the pressure.



THERMOMETER: instrument for measuring and indicating temperature, typically one consisting of a narrow, sealed glass having at one end a bulb containing mercury or alcohol that expands and contracts in the tube with heating and cooling.



OTOSCOPE: an instrument designed for visual examination of the eardrum and the passage of the outer ear, typically having a light and a set of lenses.



SYRINGE: a tube with a nozzle and piston or bulb for sucking in and ejecting liquid in a thin stream, used for cleaning wounds or body cavities, or fitted with a hollow needle for injecting or withdrawing fluids.



TONGUE DEPRESSOR: an instrument, typically a small flat piece of wood, used by health practitioners to press down the tongue in order to allow inspection of the mouth or threat.
